On June 25th, we worshipped and preached with generator-powered sound, heard a special speaker, Colleen McCormack (Te Chou's niece) from Yale University CRU staff, and had food and fun on the hill. It was a great success and soon to be a church-wide event.

LEADERSHIP: Thanks go to the faithful leaders of LifeLight who plan, serve, advice and minister. WORSHIP: The commitment to Worship at LifeLight is impressive. Over twenty youth, adults and College students play, sing and technify worship either on a regular basis or fill in when available. Praise God for You All! We have built traditions here of the Advent Wreath, Candle Light Christmas, the Prayer Wall, Thursday Virtual Prayer, Mom's Morning Prayer, Outreach Film Sundays, among others. This year we celebrated the Passover Seder on Good Friday and gathered the whole church for a Watch Night Worship and Prayer Service.

FELLOWSHIP: The greatest advance this year was the establishment of a College and Career Fellowship Group thanks to Scott and Janell Koizumi. Eight to ten weekly for fellowship, study and prayer. They have also met socially for Bowling, BBQ and a Christmas Dinner. The Brother's Fellowship gathered men to Ski Wachusett and Hot Pot and Kayak and Dinner. Thanks to Kevin and Cecilia for hosting. We had a Farewell Dinner for Gordon and Jannie Liao and the boys. We Apple Picked as a Church Family and gathered for Family Christmas Party @ the Clubhouse. Thank you, Winnie. The Sister's Fellowship met for a Movie Night in the spring and packed 28 College Care Packages in the fall. We have also celebrated Birthdays every month with a cake at Coffee Hour.

OUTREACH: We gave gifts to ten children of incarcerated parents through Prison Fellowship's Angel Tree Project. Our ministry of Christmas Caroling at the Willows in Westborough grew to reach 50 residents.

TEACHING: Pastor Eric and Pastor Steve started a series on Mark: The Action Gospel and continue to work their way through. They also taught on Ecclesiastes: Life's Big Questions, The Five Solas of the Reformation, and an Advent Series on Light. Adult classes covered Jewish Roots of our Faith and The Invested Life (Discipleship). Time was spent in small group prayer and sharing each week.
